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about Taizé Prayer

In 1940, a 25-year-old Swiss Protestant student, Roger Louis Schutz-Marsauche, purchased an abandoned house in the small Burgundian village of Taizé, France. What began as one young man's simple yet dangerous gesture of hospitality to refugees fleeing German-occupied France, has grown into an international, ecumenical community hosting as many as 2500 guests a week—most of them youth and young adults—with a focus on sung prayer and silence, Bible study and reflection, reconciliation and peace-making.

Today, the Taizé Community is an ecumenical monastic order made up of over a hundred brothers, including Catholics and numerous Protestant denominations, from over thirty nations. By its very existence, the community is a “parable of community,” seeking to be a sign of reconciliation between divided Christians and separated peoples.
