WEDNESDAY, APRIL 3, 2018

The worship space will be set up with two columns of chairs, facing the north end, with the pulpit off to the one side. The projector screen will be on the other.

GATHERING

Choral Prelude: TST CHOIR (I was glad (Central American trad. arr. Bell)

Becca to welcome, ask for announcements, Morgan to explain service and introduce Paul and Néstor etc. Chyvonne comes forward for territorial acknowledgement.

Chyvonne As we gather on this space to worship,

we acknowledge this land made sacred by Creator.

We honour those who have breathed its air,

tasted its fruits, tended its soils,

and cherished its waters for thousands of years

Among their names are the Huron-Wendat,

the Petun, the Seneca, and the Mississauga.

Today, their descendants and other Original Peoples of Turtle Island steward this land with care and fidelity.

Chyvonne lights a candle and resumes her seat.

Swee Hong: (speaks from the piano) Matt and Becca to be cantors together

As we sing this song, let us offer our song in prayer and solidarity with the people of South Africa and all those who continue on the long journey towards justice.

Sing "You are Holy" (MV 45) twice. Readers will come to the front and line up side-by-side. The musician will continue to play the song quietly but joyfully and with variations while each person reads.

Becca In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

Leanne God created the world and saw that it was very good.

When humanity turned away from God.

God sent the flood waters cleanse, and recreate.

Then, with Noah and with all creation,

God created a rainbow covenant of promise and redemption.

Caro God blessed Sarah and Abraham

with descendants as numerous as the stars.

When they were enslaved, God parted seas and delivered them.

Guiding Miriam and Moses, God led them across the desert.

All sing You Are Holy.

Alex When our ancestors wandered,

God sent prophets to call them back to faith:

Isaiah proclaimed God's abundant life for the poor.

Jeremiah rebuked idolatry and cried of God's faithfulness.

Ezekiel saw the dried bones of a broken people stitched back to life.

Carmen God's promises are continually made real,

from beginning to end.



Invitation & Peace

Presider In the name of the One who said,

"I am the Bread of Life,"

I invite you to come and feast.

In the name of the One who said,

"I am the True Vine,"

I invite you to come and drink.

In the name of the One who said,

"Love one another as I have loved you,"

I invite you to this Table: the Table of Jesus Christ.

May the peace of the Risen Christ be with you all.

All And also with you.

All exchange signs of peace.

Hymn: "All Who Hunger" (VU 460) Piano, lively tempo, could include drum

During the hymn, Rhiannon, Chyvonne, and Becca will bring forward the Gifts to the Table. After the hymn ends, Néstor will begin with these words:

Presider God be with you.

All **And also with you.**

Presider Lift up your hearts!

All We lift them up to God!

Presider Let us give thanks to our God!

All It is right to give God thanks and praise!

Presider Loving God, Redeemer of all,

we thank and praise you with our lips and with our lives, that, having created us and all things through your Word,

you welcome our prayer and praise.

For the goodness of creation and the gift of redemption,

we praise you.

For the law of holiness, inviting our faithfulness, and the call of prophets, rebuking our unfaithfulness, we praise you.

Therefore, with all that is, seen and unseen, and with all the faithful of every time and place, we join in this hymn of praise and thanksgiving:

All sing Santo, Santo, Santo.

Loving God, Holy One, we offer you praise and thanksgiving for this bread and cup, because in Jesus Christ, your only Son, you have joined yourself forever to us, uniting heaven and earth.

Therefore, we remember:
Jesus' birth into our humanity,
baptism for our belonging,
compassion for our suffering,
intimacy with our frailty,
rebuke of our pride,
forgiveness of our sin,
bearing of the cross of death,
and rising from the tomb by the power of God.

Néstor offers the Words of Institution in Spanish.

Porque yo recibí del Señor lo que también os he enseñado: Que el Señor Jesús, la noche que fue entregado, tomó pan; y habiendo dado gracias, lo partió, y dijo: Tomad, comed; esto es mi cuerpo que por vosotros es partido; haced esto en memoria de mí. Asimismo, tomó también la copa, después de haber cenado, diciendo: Esta copa es el nuevo pacto en mi sangre; haced esto todas las veces que la bebiereis, en memoria de mí.

Así, pues, todas las veces que comiereis este pan, y bebiereis esta copa, la muerte del Señor anunciáis hasta que él venga. And so, in protest against the forces of violence,

discrimination, and racism and everything that goes against your divine intent and in affirmation of the life that God gives us through mother earth and the food we share at this table, we proclaim the mystery of our faith:

All sing Christ Has Died.

Néstor raises his hands above the elements in blessing.

Loving God, creative Power,
blessing your name, we seek the strength of your Spirit to counter evil.
Come to us and bless these gifts of bread and wine,
that they may be for us the sign and seal
of your love bringing us together;
and our adoption as your children.
As we eat and drink together,
help us remember the hands who picked
the grains and harvested the grapes.
As we share this meal, make us heralds

Néstor lifts the bread and the wine, and says:

of your justice and mercy throughout all the world.

Following the example of Christ, we seek justice and equality in the unity of the Holy Spirit.

Most holy God, walk with us as we seek to follow your will, now and forever. Amen.

All sing Great Amen.

As Jesus Christ came into the world in solidarity and grace, now these gifts of God come to you, to nourish you for your vocation as God's prophetic people. Rest and be filled for the journey ahead.

As the choir sings "We come now to your table, Lord" Rhiannon, Chyvonne, Becca, and Néstor take the plates of bread and juice to the people seated. Rhiannon and Chyvonne will take one side of the assembly; Becca and Néstor the other. Row by row, they will pass the elements to each of the congregants. The congregants will wait until all have been served before consuming the Gifts. After all have been served, Néstor will proceed back to the front to lead the consumption of the Gifts with these words:

He raises his bread:

The Body of Christ: Bread for the Journey.

He eats his bread. After eating, he raises his juice:

The Blood of Christ: The Cup of Blessing.

Néstor drinks his juice and, after a brief moment of silence, leads the Prayer after Communion.

Néstor Let us pray.

We give thanks, loving God, for allowing us to commune with you and with each other. Strengthen our faith, increase our love for one another, and send us forth into the world united in the common calling of living out your gospel, rejoicing in the power of the Holy Spirit; through Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

Matt resumes his seat. Michelle comes forward to the front.
